Re: Requirement to Connect to an Existing Wastewater Collection System

In 2009, the Province amended the *Onsite Wastewater Management Systems Regulation* (Manitoba Regulation 83/2003) with a requirement for landowners to connect to existing wastewater collection systems. This amendment applies to all landowners who are currently using a private wastewater disposal system (septic field, holding tank, or ejector system) in an area serviced by a municipal wastewater collection system. Specifically, Section 8.2(1) states:

"A person who, on the day that this section comes into force, owns land in an area that is serviced by a wastewater collection system but who has not connected his or her wastewater sources to the system, must

- (a) Connect his or her wastewater sources to the wastewater collection system; and
- (b) Take any onsite wastewater management system or privy located on the land out of service and decommission it;

By the earlier of

- (c) The passing of a period of five years from the day that this section came into force; or
- (d) The transfer or subdivision of the land."

Therefore, in accordance with Manitoba Regulation 83/2003, all landowners who fall subject to this requirement must:

- 1. Connect their dwelling to the municipal wastewater collection system servicing their land before October 10, 2014, or;
- Connect their dwelling to the municipal wastewater collection system servicing their land before the transfer or subdivision of their land, if their land is transferred or subdivided before the October 10, 2014 deadline.

Please contact your local municipal government for details on connecting to a wastewater collection system.

Failure to connect by the given deadline or before the transfer or subdivision of land is an offence under The Environment Act.
